FY 2009-2010 Recovery Act Justice Assistance Grant Awards

The purpose of the 2009 Recovery Act Byrne Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program is to create and retain jobs and promote economic growth as well as to allow states to support a broad range of activities to prevent and control crime based on local needs and conditions. The State of Oklahoma was awarded \$16,394,796 in 2009 through the 2009 Recovery Act Justice Assistance Grant. Approximately half the funds, or \$7,377,658, was awarded in 2009 with the remainder awarded in 2010.

The primary use of the JAG funds in Oklahoma is to support multijurisdictional drug task forces under the Law Enforcement Purpose Area; however, funds were also utilized to support projects in the Purpose Areas of Prosecution and Courts, Prevention, Corrections and Community Corrections, and Planning, Evaluation, and Technology Improvement.

Unless noted, the following subgrantees were awarded funds for a twelve month grant with a 12 month option to renew. Some grants projects were written and awarded as one year grants.

<p>Funds will be used to provide drug and alcohol treatment for incarcerated offenders at the Jackie Brannon Correctional Facility. Jackie Brannon Substance Abuse Treatment Program is a six (6) month structured Cognitive Behavioral program designed to provide treatment for minimum security offenders who are less than 2000 days from discharge or parole. It is the intent of this program to promote and increase psychological and social functioning in the offender by educating, modeling, skill practicing, and reinforcing prosocial behaviors. Programmatic activities are designed to: 1) change attitudes; 2) reduce hostility and anger; 3) focus on harm done to victims and family; 4) relapse prevention; 5) increase self control; 6) promote more positive attitudes and performance toward work and education; 7) reduce antisocial peer association; 8) promote family communication and problem solving.</p>
