Description of Amendment:

Questions and Answers

Question: When obtaining access for a site, do Oklahoma Statutes granting OCC PSTD access to properties also extend to the selected consulting firm, subcontractors, and utility locate personnel?

Answer: **Yes.** The Oklahoma Petroleum Storage Tank Consolidation Act allows authorized representatives of the Petroleum Storage Tank Division (PSTD) to access properties where petroleum storage tank systems are or may be present or a release from a system has or may have occurred for the purpose of any reasonable investigation.

Question: If there are access issues (locked gates, etc.) prior to site mobilization and utility locators are not able to access the site to mark utilities, can alternate utility locate methods (GPR, etc.) be utilized to clear the drilling locations and can these costs be reimbursed as a non-unit cost item?

Answer: **No.** A separate state wide contract will be administered to use ground penetrating radar (GPR) to survey the entire footprint of those TOU or POU facilities the PSTD deems warranted in order to assess for the possible presence of any USTs and associated piping. For those facilities where the PSTD determines that a GPR survey is warranted, this will take place prior to the site assessment and could also aid in locating utilities. For those facilities where the PSTD determines that a GPR survey is not needed, standard utility locating services (OKIE calls) should be used to identify and mark public utilities in the target drilling areas. Should there be access issues such as locked gates, the PSTD will attempt to identify this in advance of the site assessment and work with the property owner to resolve before site mobilization.

Question: If investigative derived waste is determined to require disposal, will the OCC PSTD sign the waste profile/manifest documents on behalf of the generator?

Answer: No. A representative of the companies awarded the contracts to complete the assessments can sign any waste disposal manifests or profile as the generator of the waste.

Question: In Section C4.1.1. of the Sol, it states work is to be performed under one mobilization. Is this referring to each site in the given county or all sites? If it is all sites: Will the work be done concurrently with per diem being involved?

Answer: Per diem will be calculated automatically based on: 1) the roundtrip mileage to the furthest site to be assessed within that grouping of facilities; and 2) the total depth of all borings across all sites for that grouping of facilities.

Question: Is mileage based on the furthest site away or will it be based on going from site to site with all miles being included?

Answer: Mileage will be based on the furthest site away from the qualified contractor's office location.

Question: We have an employee who works out of a Broken Arrow, OK office. Can we include the office in Broken Arrow, as well as our Oklahoma City office in our response by issuing a separate "Responding Bidder Information" sheet for the other office?

Answer: If the company is registered with the PSTD as a single company, then only one Responding Bidder Information sheet can be submitted.
