



REAL ESTATE APPRAISER BOARD

- Supervises and regulates the licensure and oversight of real estate appraisers in the state of Oklahoma.
- Registers and regulates appraisal management companies.
- Provides appraiser education and outreach activities to Oklahoma consumers.
- Administers real estate appraiser disciplinary processes.

REAB History

Established in 1990 as an independent adjunct to the Insurance Department, this panel was devised to fulfill a then-new federal requirement that all real estate appraisers be certified by a state licensing and certification agency in order to appraise for federally-rated transactions and real estate-related transactions of the federal government.

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Oklahoma REAB Earns Top Rating

Oklahoma is just one of seven states to achieve an “Excellent” rating by the Appraisal Subcommittee (ASC). The designation means the state maintains a strong regulatory program and is at low risk of program failure.
